News from the FRENCH LINK

A total of 31 Town Twinners headed to La Loupe on Thursday 26th May, travelling by coach, private plane and car, to celebrate the 30th anniversary of twinning between the two towns. An hour's delay due to a door on 'Le Shuttle' that wouldn't open didn't dampen their spirits although they arrived at La Loupe a little later than expected. Refreshed by a drink and the pleasure of meeting their hosts and other friends the Royston Twinners left to spend the evening with their hosts.

Friday was spent visiting places of local interest: markets, chateaux, car boot sales or learning how to keep bees! In the evening all the twinners met in the centre of La Loupe to witness the unveiling of the plaque of the newly refurbished square, renamed 'Royston Square' to celebrate 30 years of twinning.

Unusually the castle was brick built, but nevertheless it had withstood several sieges including an unpleasant visit by the Gestapo in 1944. Lunch was followed by a visit to the abbey and gardens of Thiron Gardais.

Departure for home on Sunday morning was followed by a leisurely lunch in L'Albatross Hotel at Berck sur Mer, near Calais, where all the ladies were presented with a rose as it was Mothers' Day in France. The group arrived back in Royston that evening, having had a fun time together and enjoyed good weather throughout. The trip was judged by all to have been a great success.

News from the GERMAN LINK

The past 12 months have brought mixed results for the German twinning link.

In June 2015 Royston Town Band took part in the Heimatfest in Großalmerode together with a party of local people who travelled independently. Amongst them a large group from the King family headed by Norma and her husband, long time supporters of twinning. This music festival takes place every five years and Elizabeth Freeman was pleased to be able to attend.



Following the very successful 40th anniversary celebrations during 2014 we unfortunately had to cancel the trip to Germany planned for October last year due to lack of support despite extensive publicity and advertising.

On a happier note we are very pleased to report that a joint visit by Großalmerode Musikzug (band) and their twinning association will take place in October and we are expecting more than 50 visitors. Ruth Brown and Elizabeth Freeman are working with Royston Town Band to produce a varied and interesting programme of events and find hosts for everyone wishing to visit Royston.

News from the SPANISH LINK

It's now 5 years since the link with our Spanish twin town, Villanueva de la Cañada was formalised. Unfortunately since May 2015 there have been no trips or visits, although there have been invitations from both towns.

In 2015 we invited a group from Spain to visit at the end of October, to coincide with school half term but eventually postponed the visit when we still had no details of how many or who was coming with only 5 weeks to go. Our second proposed date towards the end of June this year clashed with a visit to their French twin town. We hope to be able to agree a date for 2017.

As usual we were invited to join in the celebrations of the Fiesta of San Isidro on 15th May, but in the end no one from Royston was able to attend. We did send greetings from the mayor and contributed the chairman's speech, which was read out at the dinner in Villanueva de la Cañada.

Our Spanish counterparts are always very keen to promote individual exchanges of teenagers



aged 14-17. There have been four very successful exchanges, two of which have continued with several visits each way. Despite the enthusiasm of both youngsters and parents who've taken part, there appears to be little interest in future exchanges in the Royston area. This year 7 Spanish boys and girls have requested exchanges and are still looking for partners through local schools.
